Join us for an intensive 3-day training focused on indigenous language reclamation and learning with mobile applications!

WHAT is included in the training?

CIMCC is developing mobile apps for several Pomo languages, indigenous languages of Northern California. CIMCC staff and guests will be trained using proven programs and methods in language reclamation efforts, including development tools for Apple/Android apps.

WHY is CIMCC creating apps to learn Pomo?

From 2010 to 2011, CIMCC assessed the status of Pomo languages and found, among other things, there are very few fluent to intermediate speakers of the seven Pomo languages. Also, CIMCC documented Pomo speakers for the purpose of developing future language learning resources. That time has come and mobile apps are part (not all) of our resources.

WHO is the training for exactly?

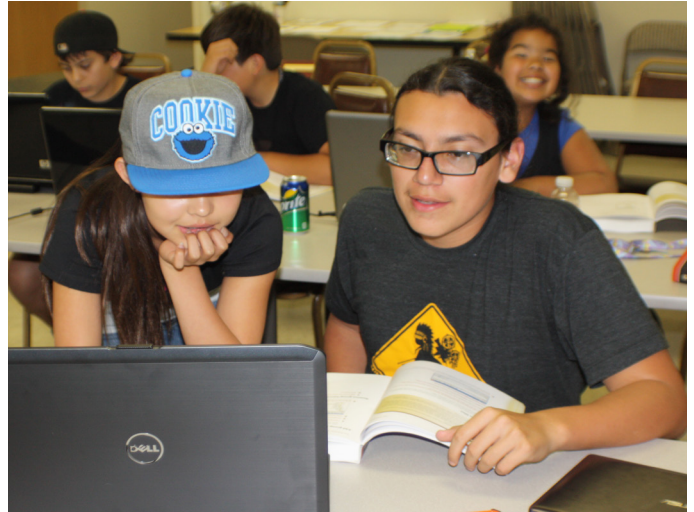
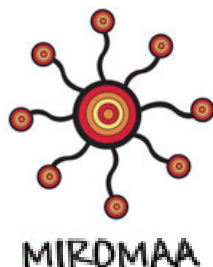
